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VBA 2024 Legislative Report Week 3

TAXING AND SPENDING

Last week, Vermont state economists offered their <u>revenue projections</u> and economic analysis for the months ahead. The bottom line of the report was good news - revenues are healthy and there are no signs of a recession on the immediate horizon.

Each January, state economists present a consensus revenue forecast to the Emergency Board comprised of the chairs of the four legislature money committees and the governor, as chair. The projections consider current and future economic conditions, as they see it, and set tax revenue targets for the next two fiscal years. This helps the elected officials prepare their budgets. The revenue report is then revisited in July to update as needed.

Along with overall positive results, if less robust than previous years, the economists reported that they anticipate a "new normal" once the largesse of federal money plays out.

The revenue forecast comes a week before the Governor is to deliver his Budget Address – scheduled for Tuesday, January 24 at 1pm. You can watch it <u>here</u>. The Governor has been warning lawmakers for months to expect a lean budget this year as the flood of federal dollars received in the last 4 years is drying up and revenues are not keeping up with legislators' spending appetite. We can expect that the Governor's budget will not receive a warm welcome from lawmakers, setting the stage for another drawn-out budget battle. Stay tuned for details.

VBA ISSUES UPDATE

On Wednesday afternoon at 1pm, the <u>House Government Operation committee</u> will begin consideration of alcohol issues that may be included in a miscellaneous tax bill.

The committee will first hear an update from DLL. The committee will then hear from the sponsors of the following bills (see bill chart below for links and descriptions of these bills):

- H. 643 An act relating to the sale of closed containers of alcoholic beverages within a first- or third-class license serving area.
- H. 680 An act relating to expanding access to special venue serving permits.
- H. 662 An act relating to the merger of entities that hold separate alcoholic beverage licenses.

The sponsors will explain why they are introducing the bill and what the bill hopes to accomplish. The VBA may want to weigh in on these bills if they move forward. You can watch the hearing <u>here</u>.
